

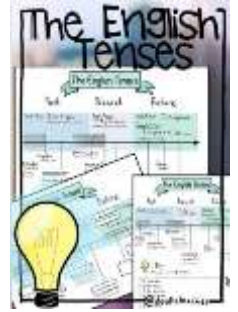


English class 9c
